

Workshop Etiquette with Jane Davies



Photos: you can take photos of anything I do, but please do not do so *during demonstrations*. If you need a photo of the demo, I'm happy to pose for it afterward. Photos during demos are distracting to the class, and I want all of your attention ON the demo. Please ask other participants before taking photos of their work.

Video: please do not take video during the workshop.

Cell Phones: please turn your cell phones off, or otherwise make them silent, during class time. If you must take a call or make a call, please do so outside of the studio.

Class starts on time: if you are late, please wait for an appropriate break to enter the studio. Ask a fellow participant to catch you up on what you missed, after I have finished. Plan on staying for the entire workshop, from beginning to end.

Let me know if you need help: If you need more input or attention from me, please let me know *early* in the class. I try to check in on everyone, but I can't read your mind. It may appear to me that you are doing brilliantly, when in fact you may want more direction or some kind of engagement with me. This is especially important if you are new to my workshops.

Supplies: In general, I don't share my paints, mediums, or drawing materials. The supply list specifies what you are to bring and what I supply, which is usually cheap drawing paper.
