



100 Paintings Supply List

- Acrylic paints: your choice of colors plus black and white. A combination of student-grade paints *and* professional quality paints works best. I prefer fluid acrylic, but tube paints will work fine as well. Include both transparent paints and opaque paints.
- Drawing materials, such as graphite, Pitt pens (or micron pens), markers, paint markers (Posca are good), watercolor crayons (Caran d'Ache NeoColor II). *Not oil pastels.*
- Collage papers: think color and pattern, not image. Solid colors, tone-on-tone patterns, as well as other patterns. Light weight! Include your own painted papers as well as found papers and decorative papers.
- Cheap Drawing Paper, 60#, or copy paper, for making collage papers and more. About 100 sheets (you may not use all of it).
- Acrylic matte medium to use for collage (I prefer Utrecht brand). Golden's Soft Gel Matte is another good choice.
- Acrylic glazing medium for diluting your paints and keeping them wet longer.
- Disposable palette (pad of paper style, 9"x12"), or palette of your choice.
- Brushes and other tools you ordinarily use (palette knife, etc.)
- Squeegee! <https://coldwaxacademy.com/squeegees/> 4" or 5" is good. You can get similar tool (a bowl scraper) from Amazon https://smile.amazon.com/gp/product/B003J373V4/ref=ppx_yo_dt_b_asin_title_o00_s00?ie=UTF8&psc=1
- Brayer - soft rubber, 1" - 3"
- Spray bottle for water
- Big roll of soft paper towels: Bounty or Viva are very good

*We will be doing at least 100 pieces, and they should be *all the same size*. You pick the size from the options given below. 9"x12" is convenient because you can purchase Bristol in pads at that size. If you prefer a square format, cut that down, or cut down larger sheets.

Choose from these suggested sizes:

- Square Format: 8"x8", 9"x9", or 10"x10"
- Rectangle Format: 7"x9", 8"x10", or 9"x12"
