



## Mixing and Modifying Colors in Acrylic Paints

## **Supply List:**

- Acrylic paints, my recommendations:\*
  - Phthalo Blue (green shade)
  - Manganese Blue
  - Napthol Red or Cadmium Red
  - Quinacridone Red or Quinacridone Magenta
  - Nickel-Azo Yellow or Indian Yellow Hue
  - Cadmium Yellow or Hansa Yellow
  - Phthalo Green (either shade) or Permanent Green Light
  - Green-Gold (optional)
  - Cobalt Turquoise or Cobalt Teal (optional)
  - Pyrrole Orange or Vat Orrange
  - Bone Black
  - Titanium White or Blick Matte Acrylic White
- Brushes I use ½" flat
- Paper 60# or 80# cheap drawing paper, or any white, smooth paper
- Acrylic matte medium or glazing liquid as an extender
- Palette I use a pad of paper type disposable palette. Any impervious, smooth, white surface should suffice.

<sup>\*</sup> If you do not have these exact pigments in a high quality paint, such as Golden Fluid Acrylics, please have, on hand at least two versions each of red, yellow, and blue; at least one orange; one green; one turquoise (optional); black, and opaque white.
